Treasurer's Report

Jon Pratten Honorary Treasurer

We have had another most satisfactory year financially. This has been assisted by a most successful The Big Swim, the support of our three levels of government through various grants, and care with our expenditure.

We had a net profit of \$8K after a donation to our Property Club of \$83K.

Income was \$281K, with the main contributions coming from The Big Swim (\$128K), sponsorship and grants (\$52K). members' subscriptions (\$51K), Surf Club functions (\$27K), and donations (\$17K).

Our thanks again go to our major sponsor for The Big Swim, Macquarie Group. Macquarie Group have sponsored The Big Swim for 24 years.

Donations and grants are financial life blood to the Club. Thank you so much again to all member, friend and private donors. The importance of the key assistance we receive from our three levels of government cannot be overstated. This year grants from the NSW government concentrated on assistance to offset the costs associated with COVID 19. Our grants from the Northern Beaches Council included assistance towards the preparation of a historical record of surf rescues at Whale Beach as well as their annual

Surf Life Saving Subsidy. Grants from the Australian Government assisted us to provide improved access to our clubhouse at two levels and a grid battery. The Australian Government Beach Safety Equipment grant will enable us to take delivery of a new IRB next year.

Australian Lifesaving Services provide us with the use of their All Terrain Vehicle at minimum cost to us.

External expenses were \$191K. Major expenses were The Big Swim (\$37K), repairs and maintenance (\$33K), administration (\$27K) and surf club functions (\$21K). Our depreciation (\$17K) was up a little as we quickly write off new lifesaving and gym equipment. Our annual electricity costs for the year were down to just over \$1K, and will drop further now our grid battery is commissioned.

Club functions and apparel sales are more important for community and member involvement than as money spinners. However, we do like them to break even and they did so again with a \$4K contribution to our bottom line.

We completed the year with \$40K cash on hand.

Statement by Members of the Management Committee

Whale Beach SLSC Incorporated (the Club) is incorporated as an Association under the Associations Incorporation Act 1984 (NSW). The Club is required to meet certain obligations pursuant to the Australian Charities and Not-forprofits Act 2012 (as amended) and Regulations, the Associations Incorporation Act 1984 (NSW) (as amended) and Regulations, the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 (as amended) and Regulations. We are covered by SLSNSW Charitable Fundraising Number 11033.

They occur to bunch together in the face of adversity and manage to come out on top, having triumphed over their fears or challenges before them. At the end of the day, it is a marathon not a sprint down (or up) the east coast of Australia. So let's pop up for air and reflect.

Conclusively, 6,449 hours were spent by our active lifesavers on the sands of Whale Beach. Whilst a tad skewed due to COVID disruptions last season, that is an impressive 2,325 additional hours, nonetheless.

Notably, many of those hours were spent enforcing preventative measures, making rescues with an array of difficult and obscure situations presented and importantly spending time in the sun (if we were lucky) with good friends and companions alike. In the 2021/22 season, not only did we save swimmers, but we also saved whales, baby turtles and even boaties from the unforgiving seas we call home.

We saw the education team positively contribute to fuel the life saving machine. Sure enough, IRB captain Lindsay Kershaw managed to get a few keen souls through IRBC and IRBD courses as well. A promising outcome came from a fresh Bronze Medallion group who immediately after put up their hands to progress their skills in the duck, showing great aptitude and a clear yearning to positively contribute to the Club and wider community alike. Sadly, both Chris Darley (CTO) and Lindsay Kershaw (IRB Captain) leave their roles this season for adventures

outside of Sydney and will be sorely missed. Thank you, lads. Fortunately, their successors are truly motivated and equipped to fill their boots and the wider Management Committee and Club has their back entirely.



Education and **Training Report**

Over the 21-22 season, our members amassed a huge 144 new awards! Each and every one of these awards contributes towards our mission of making Whale Beach as safe as possible for the entire community and I would like to thank all our members for their efforts.

In the 3 seasons that I have been Chief Training Officer (CTO), it has been a huge goal of mine to grow the education team. I am super proud of the amazing group of trainers we have now and the season wouldn't have been nearly as successful without them.

Our season started with our annual skills maintenance sessions where we saw over 150 members attend 1 of 4 sessions. This season we saw many new trainers assisting with skills maintenance in various areas. From sign-in stations to COVID marshalls, we had many new faces helping out to run the sessions and even had multiple trainers running stations on their own for the first time. Of course this season wouldn't have been possible without Guyren Smith (Newport SLSC Vice President) again coming to our rescue and running all of our IRB proficiencies.

This season saw Sophie Wines and Saskia Clarke become fully gualified Bronze Medallion trainers as well as Cameron Cormio. Maddie Zagorski and David Stenning become probationary trainers.

For the first time in years we were able to run an accelerated Bronze Medallion course that saw 14 girls from Abbotsleigh and PLC come together and not only complete their training and gain their awards in 7 days, but do so in one of the roughest weeks at Whale Beach I have seen. This season also saw 18 more of our Knox students gain their Bronze Medallions / Surf Rescue Certificates as well as 8 gain their Advanced Resuscitation

Techniques Certificate. We're very much looking forward to all these exciting younger members beginning their patrolling journeys.

On top of the Bronze course we also were able to run a standard 8 week course where we saw 10 more amazing men and women join our ranks. After many disruptions to their training with conditions, COVID and even tsunamis getting in the way, it was extremely fitting that they were able to finally complete their awards on Australia Day.

With some assistance from SLSNSW we were also able to run a First Aid course that saw 8 members gain their awards as well as an Advanced Resuscitation Techniques course that saw 10 members get their certificates. These members will go a long way in ensuring our beaches stay safe and I would encourage everyone to sign up for them next season.

I couldn't write an accurate education report without mentioning a very important cog in our machine. Our very own distinguished service award winner Lindsay Kershaw ran not 1, not 2 but a whopping 3 IRB courses this season! Our Club wouldn't be the same without him!

Sadly moving away from Sydney for university means that this will be my last season as CTO. It has been an absolute honour and privilege to hold this position for the last 3 years and I am fortunate to have been able to meet so many wonderful members of our Club while doing so. With me stepping down as CTO, I am delighted to endorse Sophie Wines as the next CTO and very much look forward to continuing to work with her to ensure Whale Beach remains the best place to 'pop up for air'.

Knox Grammar School Surf Life Saving Program

David Stenning Head Coach

The 2021-22 Season threw a lot of challenges at the Knox Grammar School Surf Life Saving Program. The start of the season was certainly interesting to say the least. With the boys still forced to be at home due to the pandemic, the school adapted and took an online approach to learning. The zoom lessons were a great way to ensure that the coaches and students got to match names with faces, however they were very restrictive in what the students could achieve. For instance, the boys enrolled in the Bronze Medallion (BM), Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC), and Advanced Resuscitation Techniques Certificate (ARTC), could not physically practice a lot of the practical components of their awards. This led to many interesting teaching techniques, including using a pillow to practice DRSABCD.

When Knox finally went back to face-toface learning, the education component of Knox's program was very disjointed. Trying to organise assessments proved to be difficult, as weather conditions forced several cancellations during the school term. COVID also forced students Thomson (Year 12) who achieved to return home and isolate, making them miss assessment days and vital training time. With many students not being able to gain their awards during Term 4 2021, a lot of boys had to wait until school returned in late January 2022 before they could attempt their awards. This meant that a lot of the boys were not able to practice their practical skills for a considerable amount of time and were not as prepared as they could

have been. Eventually, Knox gained 6 SRC's, 14 BM's and 8 ARTC's.

The competition component of Knox's program was also affected, with all inter-school carnivals except the Shore invitational being cancelled. In the end we had some fantastic results. James Willemsen (Year 8) was the only Junior Knox Competitor and was able to team up with a few other students from Shore to achieve Silver in the Board Relay and Team Swim, as well as Bronze in the Beach Sprint Relay. The Intermediate Age Group (Year 9 and 10) achieved great results in the team events, earning Silver in the Team Swim, and Bronze in the Beach Sprint Relay and Board Relay. Special mentions to Lochie Stevenson (Year 10) for getting Silver in the Board, and Bronze in the Beach Flags; and Daniel Seo (Year 10) for getting Gold in the Swim. The Senior Age Group (Year 11 and 12) performed extremely well, earning both Silver (Year 12) and Bronze (Year 11) in the Beach Sprint Relay. Special mention to Knox's most outstanding athlete of the day James Bronze in the Beach Flags and Swim, as well as Gold in the Beach Sprint.

Overall, Knox had a very disrupted season but managed to achieve some great results. Once again, I would like to thank the Whale Beach leadership team for their continued support of our program and the Knox Staff members who ensured the success of our students this season.
